In response to a question from the online audience, the Director of Pedagogical Services explained the question refers to an alternative placenseurd fort with special needs whose educational services cannot be fully met by the school board. An alternative placement implies a school subsidized by the MI and the school board has ententes with several. When a student requires an alternative placement the school and the Pedagocial Services team determines what environment will best suit the needs of the student while respecting the enrolment qualifications of the school selected. The schools used by the school board for alternative placements are alternative placements can only be accommodated if the school has space. If the school selected for an alternative placement does not have space, the support mechanisms provided to the student in their current school are reviewed and adjust to meet the student's needs until such time a space becomes available. It is recommended that parer reach out to Pedagogical Services for more detailed information on services for special needs students.
